What is the Safety Enforcement Traffic Team?

To help reduce highway crashes, injuries and fatalities, in 2007 the Montana Highway Patrol created a special team to focus on traffic safety. Now known as the Safety Enforcement Traffic Team (SETT), their mission is to detect and deter impaired driving, speeding violations, and other traffic safety offenses. SETT works statewide to provide extra patrols during high-risk events. Working closely with local law enforcement, together they've created a high-visibility enforcement presence that encourages motorists to make safe driving choices. The Montana Highway Patrol also uses SETT to educate drivers about ways they can contribute to road safety in Montana.

SETT THE GOAL TO ZERO

Help the SETT team make Montana's roads safer for everyone by following these rules:

- **Drive sober**—don't drive if you're impaired from consuming alcohol, some medications, or other substances.
- **Wear your seat belt**—every time you get in a vehicle. Even short trips at slow speeds.
- **Keep at or below the speed limit**—signs show the maximum safe speed in **optimum** conditions.
- **Minimize distractions as you drive**—avoid cell phone use, texting, eating, etc. Pull over and stop before changing CDs or taking a call.
- **Give yourself time**—leave early and account for road conditions, so you'll arrive safely.
- **Drive attentively**—watch the road and other vehicles to anticipate hazards.
- **Make safe choices**—always put the safety of yourself and others first.
- **Drive courteously**—aggressive driving is dangerous. Patience is a virtue, especially while driving.

Perhaps the greatest danger on Montana's roads is an impaired driver. SETT needs your help to identify suspected impaired drivers and get them off the road quickly.
